CIF continued enriching public policy in Indo-Canadian affairs in 2019

2019 has been a significant year in India and Canada. As the year draws to a close, we take this opportunity to reflect on the year that was.

CIF began the year with a Higher Education Forum in India. The Forum was a gathering of individuals and organizations who offered insights into the transformation of the relationship between the two countries in the field of higher education.

Over the year, we presented opportunities for our supporters and friends to listen to and engage with eminent individuals - Pierre Cleroux of BDC, Anuradha Bhosale of AVANI, a panel on good governance and public policy, and Dr. Manish Shah (head and neck surgeon).

CIF hosted a Women's Entrepreneurship Festival in May. Thanks to excellent support and overwhelming interest, the event was held at no cost to attendees. Key speakers at the gala were the Premier of Ontario, the High Commissioner of India to Canada, and the federal Minister for Immigration.

The fourth annual CIF Golf Tournament saw CIF donating \$20,000 to men and women in uniform and their families in India and Canada. CIF salutes those who serve in uniform in both countries, and is proud to donate to such a worthy cause.

This fall, CIF bid fond farewell to the High Commissioner of India to Canada, Mr. Vikas Swarup. Over his tenure, Mr. Swarup and CIF had an excellent working relationship. CIF wishes Mr. Swarup all the very best in his next post.

CIF also welcomed the new Consul-General of India in Toronto, Ms. Apoorva Srivastava. CIF met with the Consul-General and briefed her on CIF's activities. We wish her all the best as she settles into her job, and look forward to working with her.

The year also saw the sudden demise of Calgary MP Deepak Obhrai. Deepak was an ardent supporter of CIF and a member of our Advisory Board. We are grateful for his support.

November saw CIF at the Diwali celebration on Parliament Hill. The celebration was continuation of a tradition started by Deepak Obhrai, and CIF is proud to support it.

CIF wishes everyone happy holidays. See you in the new year.






