## **Chair's Message**




#### **Time to Grow Stronger Together**

Hello friends. Canada's vaccination record has been a mixed bag in the past one year. After being ahead of the curve globally in proactively acquiring the necessary doses for its citizens, we were hit with a series of challenges, most of which we had no control over, including supply issues and uncertainty regarding the various vaccine regimes. At last, we are on the right track, riding along at a fast pace, to meet targets. Over 50% of Canadians are now protected having received both the doses, and almost 70% have had their first doses as of middle of July.

We are very close to the ideal 75% mark of full vaccination targets recently set by our Public Safety Minister, Bill Blair, before we can start opening our borders. In the meanwhile, Ontario and other provinces are gearing for a gradual opening that would see robust economic activities resume, cautiously at first, but in the absence of any further surges and people still adhering to the needed preventive measures, we are good to

Responding to the brutal situation in India following the second wave of Covid-19 that robbed millions of their livelihood, DevPro and IndiaDonates supported by Canada-India Foundation launched a project titled, Food for Survival, in the Indian state of Assam. As the country begins to unlock and people are trying to rebuild their lives, the urgent need is to provide food security.

To improve food accessibility, DevPro-INDIAdonates launched its mega FoodForSurvival Mission across 13 states in India by kickstarting their campaign with the help of Canada-India Foundation in Jorhat, Assam, serving wholesome grocery kits to 270 families from ultra-poor communities. Partner NGO, North East Affected Area Development Society through its volunteers, was able to reach the families despite mobility and containment zone challenges. The initiative is currently in the process of mobilizing more resources to reach another 6600 needy families.

# HelpAge Canada has raised \$5,448 on a goal of \$12,000 for our India COVID-19 Emergency Relief Campaign.

The next arm of our campaign is focusing on Rajasthan. COVID-19 is having a devastating effect on older people in Rajasthan, including the dire economic and social repercussions. Older people are struggling to meet their basic needs with a loss of income, returning unemployed family members, and limited access to social, health and economic support.

HelpAge Canada is working with our local partners to provide:

- food and hygiene kits for older men and women and their households to support their food and hygiene needs for two months
- home isolation kits for older people who have tested COVID-19 positive

The **food and hygiene kits** will include wheat flour, pulses, edible oil and spices and hygiene supplies such as masks, sanitizer, and soap.

The **home isolation kits** will include a pulse oximeter, thermometer, vitamin C and zinc tablets, masks, sanitizer and a printed guide on COVID (prevention, protection and vaccination information).

HelpAge Canada works in partnership with others to improve and maintain the quality of life of vulnerable older persons and their communities in Canada and around the world. We are partnering on this emergency effort for India with HelpAge USA, Age International, HelpAge Korea, HelpAge Germany, DEC, and GRAVIS.
