A Tribute to Bharat Ratna Lata Mangeshkar

(1929-2022)

On February 6, 2022, India lost its most beloved voice in the person of Lata Mangeshkar who died at age 92. In an incredible musical journey that spanned eight decades, this 'nightingale of India' broke several world records in the number of songs she helmed, the diversity of languages that she lent her melodious voice to and the fan base that matched the world's most popular singers, stretching across the world.

Canada India Foundation condoles the death of this legendary figure who inspired and entertained countless Indians over multiple generations. "We will miss her presence deeply and we extend our condolences to her family and fans all over the world. Lata Mangeshkar was not just a great singer and entertainment personality; her voice brought a whole nation together in celebration or even in tragedy." said **Satish Thakkar**, Chair CIF.

In the immediate aftermath of the India China border war in 1962, she sang the famous *Aye mere watan ke logo* that energized and inspired a stunned nation and according to reports of the day, brought tears to the eyes of India's first prime minister Jawaharlal Nehru. Lata Mangeshkar was awarded India's highest civilian honour, Bharat Ratna, in 2001, in acknowledgement of decades long contributions to the entertainment world as well for enhancing India's soft power in the rest of the world.

Lata Mangeshkar performed at the most prestigious concert venues in every major city during her career, including Toronto where she made her special connection to Canada. During a United Way fundraiser in 1985, Lata, at the request of Canadian legend Anne Murray, sang <u>You</u> <u>Needed Me</u> in English to the great surprise of the audience. "Even contributions will remain unmatched, and her voice will continue to ring through even more generations to come," added **Ritesh Malik**, National Convener, CIF.
