Chair's Message



Canada and India: Fruits of an Early Harvest!

Hello friends,

Every now and then, a news item comes out of either Canada and India that gives further hope for our long-cherished goal of reaching a comprehensive trade agreement between our two countries. The latest one hinted at talks in early April between the representatives of Canada and India towards finalizing an Early Harvest Trade Pact also known as Early Harvest Scheme.

What does an Early Harvest Scheme mean? EHS is an agreement between two states (or regional trading blocs) which liberalizes tariffs on certain goods preceding the conclusion of a Free Trade Agreement (FTA). So, this is a major push forward and a sign that all past efforts between Canada and India and the various organizations and politicians rooting for such an outcome can now take comfort that the negotiations

India has such an agreement in place with Thailand under which almost eighty-two items are designated for progressive reduction in tariff that would eventually become zero. They include a huge range of commonly traded goods, from salt to salmon and diamonds to mangoes. Such arrangements between countries help them to test and verify challenges and design solutions.

An official at India's Ministry of Commerce was quoted in the press as saying that they have identified ten or eleven areas of trade that would fall under the proposed agreement though he did not identify them individually. We can make pretty good guesses what these priority areas are, but we would rather wait for the officials to confirm and not jump to conclusions here.

All we can say for sure is that we at CIF are certainly excited. Having pushed for just such an outcome all these years, it is very gratifying to see the light at the end of the tunnel. Politics and economic factors in both countries today come together to favour such a development. We have influential political leaders as well as trade officials fully on board working hard towards a resolution. (**Read more**)


