Canada India Trade Talks Enter Critical Stage

Hello friends,

As some of you know already, this month saw a real push towards the final stages of an Early Progress Trade Agreement (EPTA) between Canada and India. I am referring to the high-level visit by India's Minister of Commerce, Hon. Piyush Goyal. Minister Goyal is known for his pragmatic style of functioning and admired for his focused and timebound guidance on an impressive number of portfolios that he oversees. Besides, he also carries a nice political heft as the leader of the ruling party in India's upper house, the Rajya Sabha.

So, when we first heard about his visit to Canada to meet with our Minister of International Trade, Hon. Mary Ng, we knew the stage was getting set for a fundamental shift in the way each side viewed each other. To her great credit, Minister Ng paved the way for the breakthrough by taking a trade mission to India in 2022 conveying to the government of India Canada's earnest desire to tackle all issues regarding EPTA in a mutually respectful manner. I recall that during an interaction with CIF members, Minister Ng even pointed out that how the two ministers after referring to each other by their respective honorifics formally, was on first name basis by the end of bilateral discussions.

CIF was among the select few organizations who had the occasion to interact with Minister Goyal during his brief stay in Toronto. Many of our members are deeply engaged in the Canada India corridor by way of trade and investment. The Minister was open and detailed in his replies to the queries we raised. We came away convinced that between Minister Ng and Minister Goyal, we have two people who can definitely get this agreement done. (**Read more**)

Expert Throws Light on Obesity and Diabetes



The incidence of diabetes has exploded in the past three or four decades to become an epidemic of gigantic proportion. Today over 3 million people out of the total population of 38 million in Canada live with varying degrees of diabetes. The picture is even more challenging for Indians across the world. India today is often referred to as the Diabetes Capital of the World with 80 million people coping with the disease. Worse, it is likely to climb to 135 million in twenty years. Indians may be at a higher risk to develop diabetes along with other cardiovascular diseases. Dr. Satya Das, Endocrinologist and Assistant Professor at University Health Network/University addressed some of these issues during a CIF Expert Speaker Series engagement held recently. Dr. Das is a clinicianscientist with an interest in obesity and cardiometabolic disease and is the Medical Director of the bariatric program at UHN.

Ayurveda Speaker Series Session -23

Pharmacological & Therapeutic Effects of Khadirarishta



Ayurveda speaker series session 23 discussed the pharmacological and therapeutic effects of Khadirarishta. Khadirarishta is a polyherbal fermented formulation used by people with sensitive skin. It is an ayurvedic liquid consisting of 18 ingredients. The traditional Ayurvedic practitioners use Khadirarishta for treating skin problems such as itching, rashes, acne, atopic dermatitis, psoriasis, and urticaria. In a clinical trial, 30 patients suffering from Eczema screened by physical examination in outdoor patient department in M.A. Podar (Govt.) hospital from Worli area of Mumbai and advised to take Khadirarishta 10 ml with equal quantity of Ushnodaka (lukewarm water) thrice a day after some food for three months. It has shown remarkable results in 70% cases in Vaivarnya (Discoloration), Strava (Secretion) and Kandu (Itching) after completion of treatment.

Toronto, May 9, 2023: Canada India Foundation members and other prominent stakeholders met with **Hon. India, Canada agree to increase discussions on movement of skilled professionals, students



India and Canada have agreed to ramp up their discussions on the movement of skilled professionals and students to enhance their bilateral economic partnership. This decision was made during the sixth India-Canada Ministerial Dialogue on Trade and Investment, where Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal and his Canadian counterpart Mary Ng reviewed the progress of the seven rounds of negotiations towards an early harvest trade deal. <u>(Read more)</u>

Guggulu, an oleo-gum resin released from Commiphora mukul Tree is a natural binder as well as an excellent medicine itself. Guggulu gum is used as one of the ingredients of many imperative formulations used in the Traditional Ayurveda Medicines most of which are named with suffix 'guggulu.' It is also useful in tinnitus caused by Vata.
