# Chair's Message



**Outreach to Build Deeper Ties within Community** & Beyond for Better Canada

Hello friends,

There is a lot happening here and around the world. For those of us who are keenly invested in Canada as well India, there might be reason to be concerned at certain developments in the international arena. We have also more pressing concerns where our attention is required. Canada India Foundation is, first and last, an organization dedicated to building a strong bilateral space. We are also equally devoted to the welfare of the two million strong Indo Canadian community here. While we are deeply concerned and worry about any developments that impair the advancing of our bilateral relationship, we also realize that differences of opinion can and will arise between sovereign nations who may be otherwise aligned in their goals. a recent visit. Ms. Sunita Vyas, National Convener CIF briefed her about the CIF's philanthropic activities. Mr. Girish Kekre, Director, CIF introduced the guest to the audience.

AVANI has been serving destitute and marginalized communities since 1994. It runs various projects, including homes for girls and children, mobile classes, online education, and a library on wheels for children from waste-picker families. AVANI played a crucial role in bringing relief to the people during the COVID-19 pandemic and floods in July 2021 that hit the state of Maharashtra in India. AVANI distributed food grains and hygiene kits to the most vulnerable in society. Over the last 28 years of its existence, AVANI has successfully integrated 55,000 children into the education system.

# CIF Welcomes Brampton's Effort to Improve International Student Experience



Canada India Foundation recently endorsed the document outlining the guiding principles to improve the International Student Experience at an event attended by Mr. Satish Thakkar, Immediate Past Chair, CIF, Sheridan College President Janet Morrison and the Mayor of Brampton, Patrick Brown. The signing ceremony was held at the Sheridan College on December 18, 2023, attended by several luminaries from the community.

The Brampton Charter for Improving the International Student Experience presents a concrete action plan that will make a positive difference in the lives of international students who choose to study and stay in Brampton. The Charter includes shared principles, recommended actions and mechanisms for accountability.

It will inspire other jurisdictions to adopt similar community charters of their own, creating a national network of organizations that choose to hold themselves and one another accountable to provide a seamless and successful international student experience.
