# Chair's Message



#### A Day to Remember, Reconnect and Rejoice

#### Hello friends,

Today, January 22, 2024, is of great significance for over a billion Hindus living all over the world, and particularly in Bharat. Hindus all over the world including Canada welcomed the opening of the Ayodhya Ram Mandir with emotional fervor and a newer and stronger direction for a splendid old civilization. We have seen celebrations like never before by thousands of Indo Canadians who participated in events that marked the Pran Pratishtha ceremony conducted by the Prime Minister of India, Narendra Modi in Ayodhya, India.

Pran Pratishtha means "establishment of life force" or basically "infusing life" into the idol. In Hinduism, it is a sacred ceremony where the divine essence, referred to as prana, is invoked and transferred into an idol or image of a deity in a temple or at home. Thus, the idol is seen as a physical, tangible carrier – of God himself. Hindus don't worship idols, believing them to be Gods. Rather, they view the statue or image as physical representation of God to help them focus on an aspect of prayer or meditation.

History if not distorted and if presented as is can be a great foundation to build a brighter future. Historically pre-colonization and even before first invaders arrived in what we know as India, India was always Bharat. Not just a mere piece of land geographically - but a thriving culture, cradle of an ancient human civilization where science, knowledge, spirituality, and self-actualization had no bounds. A civilization which believed and still believes in oneness with nature and treats whole humanity as one big family. The Hindu majority Bharat gave humanity everything which is still relevant and much needed for world peace, co-existence and realizing true potential of every living being.

Goodness and abundance of Bharat attracted and invited lot of ruthless invaders who were not after India, but they were after Bharat. # **India Expects \$100 Billion in Annual FDI Flow**



In a clear sign of increasing confidence by the international business community in India's long-term economic growth, more investors from across the world, including pension funds are eyeing the India opportunity. India's IT minister Ashwini Vaishnaw indicated recently that the country can expect an annual FDI inflow of a hundred billion dollars in the coming years. (Read more.)

#### Tesla Eyeing \$30 Billion Investment in India

Encouraged by India's new Electric Vehicle policy, Tesla is rumored to be working on a massive \$30 billion investment in the next several years in India. Tesla boss, Elon Musk, is a self-confessed admirer of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Initially, Tesla may invest in a factory in India to roll out a cheaper and smaller car from its facility, the construction of it will be completed within three years. (Read more.)

Japanese assistance, the bridge will cut
traffic time by hours for travelers going
