Chair's Message



Canada's Leadership Must Remain Inspirational

Hello friends,

Sometimes events overtake us - happily so in this case. Just a month ago, I shared my concerns about the current state of Canada and some of its most pressing challenges. Yet I also expressed hope that enlightened leadership in Ottawa would begin addressing these problems, which have built up over years, and in some cases, decades.

As an organization, we have reason to welcome the very promising development in our bilateral diplomatic engagement. At the same time, challenges remain - some old, some new. Anti-immigrant rallies are new red flags when it comes to risks of Canadian soil used for targeted agendas against certain communities or countries at long term cost of Canadian interests.

The idea of Canada being against immigrants is as outlandish as the US railing against capitalism. Canada is a nation built by immigrants. From its inception as a country, the foundation of this country has been laid by the hard work, skills, strengths and spirit of successive generations of immigrants who chose to call Canada home. Who are the voices or groups rallying against immigration today? To me, this does not appear to be a spontaneous groundswell of frustration, but rather the outcome of agendas being driven - sometimes deliberately - to divide communities. We must remain alert to such forces and resist efforts to pit Canadians against one another.

Mistakes have been made, whether by design or through neglect. Today, we face a reality where too many people are seeking too few opportunities, whether in housing, jobs, or business. This is not the making of immigrants, but a failure of policy. When a nation faces economic strain, it becomes all too easy to deflect attention from policy shortcomings and place the blame on immigrants as the source of all economic woes.

Since Canada opened its doors and heart to immigrants with a reasonably fair immigration policy, Canada has been blessed with some of the finest talent in the world. Earlier generation of immigrants had ample opportunities, and they made the best use of it to build their lives while immensely contributing to Canada's growth story. Canada was and remains one of the most welcoming and open societies in the world. There has always been a win-win equation between Canada and its talented immigrants motivated to do their best for Canada's prosperity.

The current difficulties, however, have cast a shadow over this mutually beneficial arrangement, largely because of Canada's over-enthusiastic promotion of international students and temporary workers. Ottawa has now begun correcting some of these mistakes. At the same time, I want to request and caution all stakeholders that immigration should never be used as a wedge issue for short-term political gain. Canada must safeguard social cohesion while ensuring immigration serves our long-term national interests. (**Read more**)

99.8% of India's Rural Land Records Digitized

Since India launched the Digital India Land Records Modernization Programme in 2016, it has made great progress having digitized almost all the available rural land records in India. Except for Gujarat, Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu, India's urban land records are yet to be digitized. According to government sources this will be done in the next six months. 
